Straightening the popular unity for the defense of our country working class interests.

The poor electoral results of our candidates in the past autonomic elections in Euskadi and Galicia, highlight the need for a thorough analysis of the political cycle that began with the elections in Andalucía in 2019. All these events are now shaped by our participation in the Coalition Government of Spain and the current Covid-19 pandemic.

In this complex and uncertain context, the electoral results show that our federal political project is not compelling enough for the progressive population in Galicia and Euskadi, where the elections were also marked by high levels of abstention. According to the results, conservative politics and policies will be governing both territories, in a period where policies based on equity, social justice and redistribution of wealth are more needed. Besides, left-nationalist forces, which are solidly entrenched in territories with a clear country's project message are the ones picking our electoral setbacks. This result coincides with numerous internal conflicts in Unidas Podemos around the country. After four years of the beginning of this project, some political relations are still in conflict, causing in some cases divisions which have been broadcasted. Moreover, we confirm the organizational weakness and lack of implementation at a territorial level of Unidas Podemos.

We consider paramount to strengthen the popular unity of Unidas Podemos, and the need of deepening this project with more solid social and political alliances. At the same time, in order to better work at a territorial level, we need to reinforce the organizational development of the project by bolstering democratic structures.

In parallel, we must be aware of the fight for a social exit from this pandemic crisis. This is the main reason we call upon the Party, in all its levels, to mobilize in defense of the Coalition Government programmatic agreement. There will be some actors who are going to try to diminish our presence in the Government by all means, including the bad electoral results in Galicia and Euskadi.





In the upcoming months there will be some crucial debates over the reconstruction of this country after the pandemic. The PCE will continue to defend those measures essential to progress for a structural change. In this regard, we appeal to every communist person to defend the recovery of the Spanish productive sovereignty. This fight is not only about sustaining jobs, but also bolstering a legislative process to regulate teleworking, and for the dismantling of the labor reform.

Finally, it is crucial to acknowledge the hard work done by all our activists in the PCE, in Izquierda Unida, and in all organizations around Unidas Podemos. Their commitment and dedication are the fundamental elements of this political project. We must be in line with the historical period that the working class of this country requires.
